In & Around your Garden

Container Gardening

When watering containers do so in the later part of the afternoon, as the evaporation is far less at this time of day. Include some 'Water Soluble Granules' to all your containers as these will release moisture to your plants on demand. Remember plants in containers rely on us, for their nutrients.

Herb choice of the month

Angelica makes a most attractive plant in the garden, unlike most other herbs can take a little shade. The tall stems and the attractive leaves of Angelica make this an ideal cut herb for the vase. The aroma of crushed leaves in a car helps prevent car sickness; chewing a few leaves also helps with flatulence. Angelica sooths the digestive system and improves blood circulation. A mild tea made from the seeds is very good as a natural laxative.

Plant choice of the month

My plant choice for this month has to be the beautiful Clematis, considered the Queen amongst creepers! This creeper likes to grow with its feet in the shade and the plant itself in the sun, enjoys a really cold winter. Height two meter with a spread of one meter.

REMEMBER

- Fertilise and weed your lawn this month.
- Remove faded roses, feed fortnightly and spray to prevent fungal diseases.
- Hydrangeas will require deep watering at this time of year in order to produce a good display in December.
- If you have bulbs growing in the garden, inspect regularly for the Amaryllis caterpillars - if you do, spray with Garden Ripcord.
