## Welcome to another month of winter gardening!

I can hardly describe the joy and pleasure that gardening brings to me! Nothing is quite as invigorating as walking around my garden, admiring the hand of God at work...

Echeveria's are great for that very hot and dry section of your garden; (however they will also be happy with half days sun). Echeveria's produce small rose like rosettes that create a 'wow factor' in the garden! Wonderful when used as an edging plant to line a flower bed. The icy-green colour of the plant stands out against any other greenery in the garden...



St Josephs and Tiger lilies can be planted now; no summer garden is complete without a few lilies randomly planted! Remember lilies like a partial sun position.

If you have gaps in your garden then consider planting a shrub called "Euonymus – gold dust". The yellow gold colour is warming in winter and yet striking in the summer; hardy and easy to grow.

- Empty out your hose pipe once you have used it during winter. Store where the water left in the pipe won't freeze!
- July can be rather windy; do ensure that you have securely staked your roses and any other standards.

Indoor plants: - the coldest place in winter is near a window even when it is closed, hence remove any plants from the window to a warm position in your home.

- Seedling of the month has to be Schizanthus, easy to grow, flowers continually and just loves the cold...
